Accra, 27th November, 2023: The National Communications Authority (NCA) hosted a nine-member delegation from the Telecommunications/ICT and Postal Regulatory Authority of Mali (AMRTP) on Monday, November 27, 2023, for a benchmarking visit at the NCA Tower. The two-day visit was focused on the NCA's role in the implementation of rural network connectivity in Ghana.
