## RPI Engages NCA in Strengthening Public Education and Collaboration

*Accra, April 4, 2025* - The Director of the Radiation Protection Institute (RPI), Dr. Eric Tetteh Glover, and his team paid a courtesy call on the Acting Director General of the National Communications Authority (NCA), Rev. Ing. Edmund Yirenkyi Fianko, at the NCA Tower in Accra.

The purpose of the visit was to discuss ongoing collaboration and future areas of partnership in promoting public awareness and ensuring safety within Ghana's telecommunications ecosystem. The meeting underscored the significance of augmenting public education on radiation, specifically focusing on the effective communication of radiation exposure information to the general public.

Speaking at the meeting, Rev. Ing. Fianko acknowledged the importance of collaboration considering that public knowledge plays a crucial role when purchasing telecom devices and services. He indicated that there is a need to draw a clear connection between radiation testing and its impact on consumers by demystifying misconceptions and actively engaging the public to stimulate civic participation and encourage all stakeholders to make responsible choices that promote safety and compliance.

The Director for RPI, Dr. Eric Tetteh Glover, stated that RPI tends to collaborate with the NCA in monitoring mobile phone base stations as required by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), with both organizations playing critical roles in regulatory oversight and public safety. This, he said, will reinforce the mandates of both the NCA and RPI to serve the public more effectively. The RPI team included Prof. Stephen Inkoom, Deputy Director of the Institute; Dr. Samuel Osei, Head of the Non-Ionizing Radiation Unit; and Dr. Philip Deatanyah, Manager at RPI.
