LIBERIA TELECOMMUNICATIONS AUTHORITY VISITS NCA FOR KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE AND INSTITUTIONAL LEARNING

Accra, 9th June, 2026 – The National Communications Authority (NCA) on Tuesday, 9th June, 2026, hosted a two-member delegation from the Liberia Telecommunications Authority (LTA) at the NCA Tower in Accra for a knowledge exchange session aimed at sharing experiences and best practices on institutional development, technology adoption, operational systems, and modern workplace infrastructure.

The delegation was led by Mad. Joy Chichi Onos, Director for Information Technology of the LTA, and included Mr. Prince Goah, Acting Director of Administration.

Welcoming the delegation, the Deputy Director General in charge of Technical Operations at the NCA, Mr. Suleman Salifu, highlighted the longstanding relationship between Ghana and Liberia and the continuous exchange of knowledge between the two institutions on various regulatory and technological matters.

He noted that the NCA remains committed to supporting peer regulatory institutions within the sub-region through collaboration and knowledge sharing, and expressed confidence that the visit would provide valuable insights to help the delegation achieve its objectives. He also encouraged the delegation to engage freely with the Authority's subject matter experts throughout the visit.

Explaining the purpose of the visit, Mad. Joy Chichi Onos said the LTA is developing a modern, technology-driven facility and considered it important to engage with peer institutions that have successfully undertaken similar initiatives. She noted that beyond infrastructure, the delegation was interested in learning about the systems, processes and organisational practices that support effective operations within the NCA.

She commended the NCA for its reputation as a leading regulatory institution in the West African sub-region, noting that the Authority is widely recognised for its sound regulatory practices and openness to knowledge sharing. According to her, the NCA frequently serves as a benchmark institution for the LTA and is often referenced in discussions on regulatory excellence and institutional development.

Mad. Onos further indicated that the delegation was particularly interested in understanding how the NCA has integrated technology into its operations and how staff have adapted to the various technologies deployed internally. She noted that learning from a regional peer institution with similar operational realities would provide practical insights to support the LTA's ongoing development efforts.

As part of the visit, the delegation was taken on guided tours of the NCA Tower and key operational facilities, including the NCA Computer Emergency Response Team (CERT), the Broadcasting Monitoring Centre, and the NCA Media Studio. The tour provided an opportunity for the delegation to gain first-hand insight into the Authority's operational environment, technological systems, and service delivery processes.
